### UPDATE ON LAKE WATER LEVEL

As many are aware, the water level in our lake is down drastically this year.

THE AGREEMENT: The lake water and the lake shore are owned by the Silver Creek Irrigation District (SCID), which built the dam and the lake for the purpose of their irrigation customers down stream. The WMLCRID has an agreement with the SCID to keep the water above a certain level between Memorial Day and Labor day. That level is represented by the "O-Mark" painted on our boat ramp. The WMLCRID currently pays \$5,000 per month for the SCID to keep the water above that level

DRY CONDITIONS: We all desire for the lake level to stay way up above the "O-Mark". However, due to very dry conditions, the water level never made it higher than 7ft above this year. and without a lot of rain, it looks very likely that we will be going below the "O-Mark". For comparison, last year we reached 13ft above, and worked our way down throughout the summer. Again, due to the lack of rain this year, there is not enough water coming into the lake to keep the water level rising.

WORKING WITH SCID: The County, the SCID, and the WMLCRID have been in regular communication regarding the lake level. The SCID board is very concerned that they are likely going to have to drop below the "0-Mark", and they are working diligently to try and keep it above. They have all of their wells in action, to try and offset the needed water flow. Unfortunately, there are a couple of their ditches that are only fed by the water flow in the creek below the dam, so they need to have at a minimum level of water flowing out of the lake.

ACTION BY THE COUNTY BOS: While the existing agreement between WMLCRID and SCID



did allow for the rare possibility of the water lever going below the "0-Mark", and it did specify that the WMLCRID will pay a lower amount if this happens... the agreement did not specify how much less, or how it would be determined. On TUE June 22, the County BOS approved an amendment to the agreement, clarifying how the proration will work. Basically, WMLCRID will pay 25% less for every foot below the "0-Mark" for that month. Of course, we all would rather pay the full price each month. AND have the water level up. We want to thank the SCID Board and County Management for working together to clarify this agreement.

### UPDATE ON THE LAKE WATER LEVEL

In early July, the water level in our lake was SEE down drastically. But then the once-in-alifetime "flash flood" event happened on THU 7/22 and FRI 7/23. This extreme weather event dumped tons of water into our "watershed" (the area to the south of us that feeds surface-wash water directly to our lake. This watershed comes all the way from those mountains to our south, on the other side of highway 60. This extreme weather event caused our lake to rise 15 vertical feet in 12 hours, and another 3 vertical feet in the next 12 hours. That is a lot of water on the move, which lifted our docks and moved them over. There was even an evacuation order issued for the towns of Taylor and Snowflake (downstream from the lake) due to the expectation of

### UPDATE ON THE LAKE WATER LEVEL

In early July, the water level in our lake was down drastically, at 1.5 feet below our "O" mark. But then the once-in-a-lifetime "flash flood" event happened on THU 7/22 and FRI 7/23, which brought our lake up to well over full. Currently, here in October, our lake's water level is back down to the 5 foot mark, as the SCID has been utilizing the water for the purpose of agriculture downstream. WMLCRID staff has been in contact with SCID staff regarding the lake level, and has learned that at this time the SCID is no longer pulling water out of the lake. The lake level should continue to rise over the winter, as the SCID gets ready for the 2022 season.

### REPAIR OF FAILING DOCK FLOATS

There were several floats that were failing on the "rental" dock, resulting in a serious sag in the dock structure (See Before Pic). This summer, WMLCRID staff was able to replace those three failing floats,

Since it was created in 1993, the WMLCRID has operated in this manner, with the County BOS as its Board, However, there is a strong desire by Members of the District to transition control of the District from the County BOS to an Elected Board made up of Local Community Members. To meet the community's desire for local control of the District. Navajo County Supervisor Jason Whiting has spearheaded the effort to change the Arizona State Statute. He has put together all the information needed for the legislative item; and he has worked all the other Arizona Counties to garner their support as well. The next step is for the Arizona State Legislature to take up the issue during their next legislative session, typically convening in January and adjourning in June. Should the State Legislature pass this item, Navajo County will continue to support the district all the way through the election of local officials and beyond... until the district is ready to stand on its own. This new State Statute would be an exciting change for the District and is strongly supported by both the WMLCRID Staff and by Navajo County as well. WMLCRID Staff will continue to provide updates on this situation as they develop
